THE DR. ALICE WEXLER UPSTANDER STORY

Even though I'm not on the autism spectrum, I've written a book on the subject and share many qualities with people who are. I don't make friends easily, I'm not good at small talk and get bored quickly when others do. My mind drifts when others are speaking because they'll say a word that I associate with another subject and I need to consciously pull myself back to the speaker.

However, my husband is on the autism spectrum. And like many on the spectrum, he excels in certain subjects. For example, he has never studied physics but he understands the most complex theories that others have to study for years to understand. I encourage him to write about his unique theory of gravity and I have edited all his work, although now I only need to make minimal comments.

He tells me that when he was a young boy he didn't like sports, although he was good at all of them. Everyone wanted him on their team, but he preferred to watch birds and catch butterflies.

Nature is very important to him, and it makes him happy. I love and

appreciate his love of nature. However, a terrible incident happened at summer camp. Since his interests didn't align with the other boys, he created his own projects and activities. Some of the boys would start fist fights with him because he was different, especially one older boy who was much bigger than him.

One summer he started a nature room that was filled with many kinds of live creatures he found in the camp. One day he returned to find that someone had killed all his frogs, toads, bats, and salamanders. He never found out who did it. It was a devastating event that had a lifelong impact. When he told me I was also devastated since I also have a love of all living things. Like many autists, he is extremely sensitive, caring, and loving. I brought him to Costa Rica in 2007, knowing he would fall in love with it. We bought property overlooking the ocean that year and moved to the jungles four years ago to live in nature, surrounded by monkeys, birds, flowers and palm trees.

Alice Wexler, author of Autism in a Decentered World (2016) and co-editor of Contemporary Art and Disability Studies (2020), received a BFA at Boston University and an MFA from the Royal College of Art, London, UK, where she graduated with distinction. Wexler received her EdD in Arts and Humanities from Columbia University, Teachers College. She was Professor of Art Education at SUNY New Paltz from 1999-2015, specializing in disability studies, and continues to teach as an invited lecturer.












































































FINAL WORDS FROM THE ARTIST CONNOR IMES

When I was a child, I felt I was very ordinary. I rode my bike around the neighborhood in search of things to do and people to play with, I went to school, I loved to watch cartoons, and I would beg my mother to buy whatever candy was near the register almost every time we went to the grocery store. I was confused to find that I had trouble making friends and fitting in at school. Even worse was that my classmates would take advantage of my difficulty understanding social situations and sarcasm to make fun of me. I spent my entire childhood wondering why the other children treated me like I was different from them. I got an answer after getting diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder in the fall of 2020. I'm still an ordinary person with hopes, dreams, and loved ones despite being autistic. People don't realize this because they can't get past my autistic traits that impact how I interact with people and the world around me. I took inspiration from my experiences and looked back on

I took inspiration from my experiences and looked back on these memories with deep reflection while creating the story of Delilah and her friend Bee, who extended kindness and understanding when nobody else would.

The word "disability" describes conditions that affect learning, language, the physical body, or behavior, with autism falling under this category. Being disabled is hard because of the world trying to make it that way.

This is because of ableism, which is the act of being mean to people only because of their disability.

I experienced ableism due to being autistic throughout my life, but I wasn't diagnosed until recently.

How did this happen?

Children are much smarter than adults think they are.

It's so interesting how children can spot characteristics

of a disability in a child before adults can.

From what I've seen, it's usually not the knowledge of the disability

that causes bullying in school but the behaviors

that come with being disabled. It's the mindset of "Let's bully the weird kid

who can't understand jokes, makes noises for seemingly no reason,

and flaps their hands!" rather than "Let's bully the disabled kid!"

This ableist bullying can make children feel very sad and lonely,

but it doesn't have to be this way.

It's very easy to do acts of kindness every day.

As if there were a stop sign in front of us all,
take a moment to think instead of using hurtful words.

The world for disabled students will be a much happier place
both in and out of the classroom because of it.
